SAINIK SCHOOL PURULIA
WEST BENGAL

SAINIK SCHOOL PURULIA is a residential English Medium Public School for boys and it imparts Public School Education with Military bias. The students are selected for admission in class VI & IX on the basis of an All India Entrance Exam. The School follows CBSE syllabus and is a member of IPSC.

1. AIM : The aim of the school is to prepare the boys academically, physically and mentally for entry into the National Defence Academy and other coveted walks of life. Character, team spirit, dedication to purpose, patriotic outlook, courage of conviction, dignity of labour, high sense of discipline, loyalty, integrity, initiative, esprit-de-corps and desire to serve the country with zeal and efficiency are the qualities which are promoted by training in the Sainik School.

2. SCHOOL CREST : The banyan tree inspires learning, wisdom and enlightenment. It also depicts a sense of permanence and durability, its trunk shows links of industry. The leaves signify evergreen youthfulness. The full bloomed lotus magnifies the richness in intellect and culture. The hill stands for firmness and the flowing water signifies dynamism. The inscription stresses on 'Knowledge and Discipline'.

3. MOTTO : The school motto "CAN DO IT" signifies an indomitable spirit, determined to strive, to achieve, and not to yield till the aim is fulfilled.

4. LOCATION : Sainik School campus is located in the midst of nature in most salubrious and picturesque surrounding with trees, orchards and green fields all around, far away from dust, hustle and bustle of the city life, standing majestically between lawns and meadows on an area of about 280 acres on Purulia-Ranchi Road. The School has been honoured to receive 'The Telegraph School Award For Excellence 2009 & 2011'. It is well connected with different parts of the country both by rail and road. The distance of the school from the Purulia Junction (SE-Rly : Howrah-Adra- Chakradharpur Section) is about 8 Kms and from Purulia Town is about 5 Kms. Direct trains to and from Kolkata (Howrah), Delhi, Mumbai, Chennai, Gauhati, Patna and Asansol are available from Purulia Junction.

5. ADMINISTRATION : The Administration of the Sainik School is vested in an autonomous body under the Board of Governors with Union Minister of Defence as its Chairman. The Chief Minister and Education Minister of the State, where the Sainik Schools are located, are also the members of the Board of Governors. Each Sainik School has a Local Board of Administration with a Senior Defence Officer of the minimum rank of Major General as its Chairman. The General Officer Commanding, Bengal Area is the Chairman of the Local Board of Administration of Sainik School Purulia. The Local Board of Administration meets at regular intervals to review the progress of the School and to adopt measures for its improvement and progress.

6. CLASSES : The School caters for classes from VI to XII under the 10+2 scheme of Education, affiliated to the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE), New Delhi. The School is also the member of IPSC, Interact Club and IAYP. Admissions are made in classes VI & IX only.

7. CURRICULUM : The school prepares the boys for the following examinations: (a) All India Secondary School Examination (Std. X) conducted by the CBSE, New Delhi. The medium of instruction is English with Bengali and Hindi as compulsory subjects upto class VIII. Other main subjects taught upto class X are English, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Life Science, History and Civics, Economics, Geography, SUPW, Health & Physical Education as prescribed by the CBSE. Computer education forms part of the curriculum. (b) Union Public Service Commission Examination for admission to the National Defence Academy and

Naval Academy during Std. XII. (c) All India Senior School Certificate Examination (Std. XII) conducted by the CBSE, New Delhi. The school caters for the SCIENCE STREAM only and subjects taught are English, Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Computer Science, General Awareness and Physical Health Education.

8. E-CLASS ROOMS : In keeping with the latest technological developments and to provide a holistic modern learning experience, all the class rooms of the school have been fitted with E-Learning System.

9. CO-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES : While major emphasis is laid on the academic progress of the boys, the school also provides ample scope for the development of their creative abilities and skill in Art and Crafts and variety of the other hobbies. The boys are motivated to learn by doing and participating in these activities according to their aptitude.

10. GAMES : The school provides adequate facilities for various games like Cricket, Lawn Tennis, Squash, Football, Hockey, Volleyball, Badminton, Basket Ball and Table Tennis etc. Athletic activities are regular. PT forms an integral part of their physical training programme. The school also has a well equipped Gymnasium.

11. SWIMMING POOL : The school has 25 Mt. swimming pool with a view to incorporate swimming as an intergrated learning activity.

12. RECREATION : The school organises films and video shows for boys as a part of their training-cum-recreation. Films of educational value and selected feature films are screened. Educational tours to various places of historical and industrial significance are also arranged from time to time in addition to motivational trips to various Defence Establishments like NDA, IMA, AFA etc.

13. NATIONAL CADET CORPS : NCC training is compulsory for all students and forms an integral part of the school curriculum. The school has a full fledged Junior & Senior Division NCC Company. Headmaster (Officer Commanding - NCC Coy) and qualified instructors from regular Army and NCC Officers in the organisation conduct the training. The cadets regularly take part in Annual Training Camps, Republic Day Parades in New Delhi, Kolkata, Purulia and various other training camps and training events. Outward bound courses are organised periodically to promote leadership qualities. Senior boys are detailed to attend Adventure Courses at Himalayan Mountaineering Institute. Rock Climbing and Adventure Leadership Courses are organized during the vacation. Hiking, Trekking etc. are also encouraged.

14. HORSE RIDING TRAINING : Horse Riding Training facilities is available for the cadets. This training helps the cadets to join NDA (National Defence Academy), OTA (Officers Training Academy) and other Defence Institute / Academy.

15. COMPUTER TRAINING : The School has a well equipped Computer Lab. Computer training has been introduced as a part of school curriculum and as a subject at 10+2 level. All the students get training in computers and access to the facility of e-mail and internet.

16. WORKSHOP, LABORATORIES AND LIBRARY : There is a well equipped workshop to teach wood-craft to the boys who learn the skill of making various utility items of everyday life. Well equipped laboratories exist in the school for Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Computer, Mathematics, Geography and Language. The school library is enriched with books on various subjects in English, Hindi and Bengali languages, A large number of newspapers and periodicals are available in the Reading Room and House Dormitories.

17. HOUSES : The school is sub-divided into four houses namely Patel House, Tagore House, Tilak House and Chittanranjan House. All boys are accommodated in these houses under the care and supervision of the House Masters, House Tutors and Hostel Superintendents. All new entrants, (Class-VI) are accommodated in a holding house (Netaji House) under the care and supervision of the House Masters, House Tutors and Matron.

18. HEALTHY COMPETITION : The school encourages healthy competition among the houses to excel collectively in studies, games and other developmental activities. The boys take active part in the administration of their house. Each house has a House Captain, Vice-Captain and Prefect who are responsible for maintaining discipline and orderliness within the House.

19. MESSING : All boys dine together in a well furnished common dining hall. The cooking arrangements are supervised by a qualified Mess Manager. A mess committee with the representation of the staff and boys meets every month to work out weekly menu and discuss various suggestions for the improvement of the mess. Vegetarian and non-vegetarian menu are catered for keeping in view the health and taste requirements of the boys.

20. MEDICAL ATTENTION : The health of the boys is regularly attended to by a qualified Doctor assisted by a Nursing Assistant. The school has its own Medical Infirmary. Cases of serious illness are reported to the parent immediately. All serious cases are also referred to District Sadar Hospital, Purulia.

21. BOOKS AND STATIONERY : Text books and essential stationery items are supplied to the boys by the parents. Some special books and extra stationery may be made available to the boys on payment, through the school CSD canteen and cafe.

22. CSD CANTEEN : A well stocked canteen with stores from Canteen Stores Department is run by the school.

23. EXAMINATION AND TESTS : The school follows examination system as per the Remodeled Assessment Scheme under the directives of CBSE from classes VI to X (Ref : Circular No. Acad 05/2017 dated 31st January 2017) . Class XI and XII cadets are given 2 monthly Tests, 2 Term Tests and Pre board or Pre Centralised Tests. Progress reports are sent to the parents regularly after the tests. The cadets who do not show satisfactory progress in the tests are warned at the end of each test and remedial coaching classes are arranged for weak students regularly.

24. PROMOTION : As per the CBSE / Sainik Schools Society Rules and Regulations.

25. SCHOOL TERMS, VACATION AND LEAVE : The academic year usually consists of two terms. The School closes for two vacations i.e. Summer vacation during May - June, Puja vacation during Oct - Nov. Parents / Guardians of junior boys (VI-VIII) are to collect their son / wards from the school on commencement of vacation and to bring them back on re-opening of the school. The senior boys (IX-XII) will be permitted to go home unescorted under their own arrangement. A circular to this effect is sent to parents / guardians well in advance. The hostels and the mess remains closed during the vacations. Boys who are not collected within 24 hours from the commencement of the vacation are to go home at the risk of their parents / guardians. Leave during the term is not granted except in emergent circumstances. Parents / guardians are advised to plan celebrations / functions like marriage of close relatives and thread ceremonies etc during vacations in the interest of their sons / wards progress. **Parents are permitted to visit school to meet their sons / wards only on 2nd Sunday every month between 0900 hrs. to 1800 hrs.**

26. OVERSTAY ON LEAVE / VACATION : Any absence from the school during the session without genuine reason is not permitted. Parents / guardians are advised not to detain their wards at home on expiry of the vacation / break / leave, failing which a fine will be imposed on the boy. The boys having less than 75% attendance are not permitted to appear in the Annual examination.

27. VISIT BY PARENTS / GUARDIANS : Parents / guardians may visit their wards between 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. only on second Sunday of each month. It is, however, expected that the parents will not meet their boys more than once in a month. Visitors are to meet their wards at prescribed place only. They are not permitted to visit the boys in hostel and take them anywhere outside the school campus.

28. PARENTS CO-OPERATION : Parents / Guardians are requested to co-operate with the school authorities in maintaining discipline and inculcating diligence, initiative, upright behaviour and courtesy among the students. This is only possible if the parents strengthen our hands by:

- (a) Attending promptly to the school circulars regarding fees, vacation, escorts and progress report and complying with the instructions regarding extra attention to studies of their wards during vacations.
- (b) Not asking for leave of absence for their wards to attend weddings and other routine social or religious functions at home.
- (c) Not to visit the boys except on second Sunday of each month & Holidays. For essential visit on other days prior approval of the Principal should be obtained.
- (d) Equipping the boys correctly with clothing items and other necessary items as intimated by school.
- (e) Ensuring that the boys rejoin the school on scheduled date after leave / vacation.
- (f) Queries should be brief and to the point. All instructions must be acted upon promptly without entering into undue correspondence. All letters should quote the Roll No., Name, Class and the House to which the student belongs to facilitate prompt disposal. Enclose a self - addressed and stamped envelope always for reply.

29. SCHOOL FEES Etc. : Details of fees and other charges payable by the parents / guardians of boys are given below :- (Subject to amendment by the Board of Governors & Sainik Schools Society from time to time) :-

30. Other than tuition fees, all other amounts will be paid in full at the beginning of the academic year before the 5th of July or at the time of fresh admission. First installment of tuition fees will be paid in advance at the time of admission. Final installment is to be paid after the Puja Break.

31. REMITTANCE TO SCHOOL : All dues to the school be paid / remitted duly addressed to the Principal, Sainik School, Purulia. Payment of dues to any member of the school staff for remittance to school, other than the Accountant is strictly prohibited. Demand proper receipt, in case of cash payment. Full details of the remittance and the particulars of the boy, including his Name, Roll no, Class and House should invariably be written neatly on the application forms/back of Bank Draft. In case remittance of dues paid by bank

draft, the draft to be made in f/o. Principal, Sainik School Purulia, payable at Purulia.

32. CASH AND VALUABLES : Boys are not permitted to keep cash or valuable articles, transistors / music system, mobile phone etc. in their possession (Disciplinary action will be initiated). Money order should not be sent to the boys. All remittances must be addressed to the Principal only.

33. SCHOLARSHIPS : Liberal scholarship are awarded to the eligible students as follows:

(a) State Govt. Scholarship (Merit cum Means) : The Govt. of West Bengal offers full, 3/4 & 1/2 scholarship to all the eligible boys who fulfil the following conditions :-

(i) The boy must be a domicile of West Bengal.

(ii) To be eligible for a Govt. of W. Bengal scholarship, a student must secure not less than 50% of the total marks in the entrance examination for admission to Sainik Schools.

(iii) The boys should continue to score a minimum of 45% marks in each subject and 55% marks in aggregate in the annual promotion exam every year to retain his scholarship.

(b) The rate of West Bengal Govt. Scholarship (Merit cum Means) are determined on the basis of the total income of the parents as follows :-

(c) **Govt. of West Bengal Scholarship Governing Conditions**

(i) Parents of the student must be a Domicile of West Bengal.

(ii) Parents/Guardians of the student will have to enter into an Agreement with the Board of Governors, Sainik Schools Society in the manner and for the purposes laid down in rule 4 of the West Bengal Sainik Schools Scholarship rules.

(iii) No scholarship shall be awarded if a boy is enjoying any other scholarship or financial assistance in any shape from any other source.

(iv) The scholarship shall be awarded for one year in the first instance to be renewed on yearly basis for the full duration of the student's course of studies at the Sainik School, subject to periodical reports from the Principal of the school regarding the student's general conduct, discipline, medical fitness and performance and also subject to the further conditions that the student in receipt of the scholarship has secured not less than 45% marks in each subject and 55% marks in aggregate in the annual examination.

(d) **Ministry of Defence Scholarship :** It is available to the children of serving and ex-servicemen of the three services as per details given below :

(e) **MOD Subsidy** : In addition to the above, Ministry of Defence is providing subsidy of approximately Rs. 15,000/- every year to all the students as financial assistance.

34. THE RENEWAL OF SCHOLARSHIP : The renewal of scholarship will be subject to the good conduct and progress of the student. If at any time the Principal feels that a boy is not justifying the scholarship granted to him, he may initiate action to withdraw the scholarship. Parents / guardians will, however, have the option to withdraw their sons/wards from the school or to pay full fees in such cases.

35. WITHDRAWALS : The boys may be withdrawn from the school on the following grounds.

(a) **Medical Grounds** : If a boy becomes medically unfit and is likely to be unfit for entry into NDA, he is to be withdrawn from the school. He may, however, be permitted to continue his studies on payment of full fees and other expenses from the date he is found medically unfit. Cases with Hansons's diseases will be compulsorily withdrawn.

(b) **Withdrawal due to non-payment of fees** : Repeated defaulters who do not pay the fees regularly may be withdrawn from the school. The parents are required to clear the dues and also to refund any amount that might have been sanctioned as scholarship by the Government in such cases.

(c) **Withdrawal on Parents Request** : Boys are accepted for admission with the understanding that they will remain in the school for the entire course. Should they, however, be withdrawn due to personal reasons, parents will have to pay fees in accordance with the school rules. Notice of withdrawals must be given in writing to the Principal two months before the commencement of the following term. Failure to give notice will entail the forfeiture of caution money. Parents of boys who are in receipt of scholarship can withdraw them only after repayment of the entire amount of scholarship enjoyed by the boys. Parents withdrawing their children after 30 Sep. of a year should pay fees for that full academic session.

(d) **Withdrawal on Disciplinary Ground** : The Principal can without assigning any reason, withdraw any boy from the school if he considers the boy's conduct, behaviour or influence to be in any way detrimental to the interest of the school.

36. CLOTHING & OTHER MATERIAL : List of clothing and other necessities which are to be brought by the student at the time of his joining the school will be sent along with admission call letter.

37. GENERAL : Parents/guardians of the boys admitted to the school will be deemed to have read, understood and agreed with the contents of this prospectus. They will also be deemed to have accepted the rules, regulations and conditions of Sainik School Society rules and regulation and orders in vogue regarding admission and continuance of their wards / sons in Sainik School Purulia.

38. INTER SAINIK SCHOOL TRANSFER : Transfer from Sainik School Purulia to another Sainik School is not permissible.

10. Boys are admitted strictly as per the order of Merit in the Entrance Examination and Interview subject to medical fitness.

11. Application in respect of underage / overage candidates or incomplete in any respect or received without proper date of birth certificate will be REJECTED.

12. Parents / guardians are required to submit the domicile certificate/ Permanent Residential certificate / SC / ST certificate of their ward at the time of filling of forms, duly signed by the District Magistrate, failing which their sons / wards will not be eligible for admission in the school.

13. Candidates who have appeared earlier in the Entrance Examination for admission in any Sainik School are NOT eligible to apply again.

14. Defence service personel / Ex-Servicemen are required to submit a service certificate duly recorded with their permanent Home address from OC unit / attested photostat copy of the Discharge certificate to determine the eligibility for placing the boy in the merit list of Defence category for admission with Defence Scholarship. Non-submission of the above certificates by the parents / guardians at the time of interview will debar the names of their sons /wards from being included in the list for admission.

15. RESERVATION OF SEATS :

(a) 67% seats are reserved for the boys domiciled in the state of West Bengal and 33% for the domiciles of other states.

(b) Out of the total seats, 15% seats are reserved for SC and 7.5% for ST candidates. 25% seats are reserved for sons of Defence Service Personnel including Ex-Servicemen. Reserved seats for the children of Defence category if lying vacant will be filled up from Coast Guard applicants.

16. QUALIFYING MARKS IN THE ENTRANCE EXAMINATION :

(a) For SC/ST candidates - No. minimum marks

(b) For others - minimum of 25% marks in each subject and 40% marks in aggregate. The detailed mark list will be made available only after declaration of final results. The detailed mark list will be supplied only to parents/ legal guardian of candidates on payment of Rs. 100/- to the Principal through DD/IPO. Copy of Answer Sheets will not be provided.

17. CENTRES FOR THE ENTRANCE EXAMINATION (Std. VI & IX) :

The Entrance Examination will be conducted simultaneously at the following centres:

(a) KOLKATA, PURULIA, BURDWAN & SILIGURI in West Bengal and PORT BLAIR in Andaman and Nicobar Island. Subject to minimum of 20 (Twenty) Candidates for the Centre, otherwise, candidates are to appear in the exam centre at Kolkata.

(b) All Sainik Schools and other centres fixed by them in respective State.

NOTE : The School authority reserves the right of cancelling any centre, if sufficient number of candidates are not available for the particular centre. The applicants should, therefore, also indicate their second choice of centre.

18. Certificate of Age : Application for admission must be supported by attested copy of Certificate of Birth as indicated below : (Any application not supported by the Birth Certificate will be rejected without any reference to the parents) at the time of filling of forms.

(i) Attested copy of Certificate of Birth issued by Municipality / Corporation / Gram Panchayat / Birth and Death Registration Office of State Government (issued under Section 12/17 of Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1969 and State Government Rules).

(ii) In case of boys who have not attended any recognised school/ institution, parents/guardians may submit the attested copy of Birth Certificate issued by the Municipality / Corporation / Gram Panchayat / Birth and Death Registration Office of State Government (issued under Section 12/17 of Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1969 and State Government Rules) and Transfer Certificate duly attested by the District Inspector of the Schools of that District.

(iii) In case of boys whose parents are Defence Service Personnel or Ex-Serviceman, a date of birth certificate issued by the Record Office as per the Service Book records as evidence of Defence Service Personnel or Ex-serviceman Children and attested copy of Certificate of Birth issued by Municipality / Corporation / Gram Panchayat / Birth and Death Registration office of State Government (issued under Section 12/17 of Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1969 and State Government Rules) will be accepted as evidence of age.

(iv) Boys seeking admission to class IX will have to produce a attested copy of Certificate of Birth issued by Municipality / Corporation / Gram Panchayat / Birth and Death Registration Office of State Government (issued under Section 12/17 of Registration of Births and Deaths Act, 1969 and State Government Rules) and Bonafide Student Certificate from the school (Must be a recognised school) in which they are studying in class VIII.

NOTE : Parents/guardians are requested to mention their own postal address on the application and self-addressed envelopes.

19. AGREEMENT BOND : Parents/guardians of students who are selected for admission will be required to execute an agreement bond prior to the admission of their sons / wards. Proforma of agreement bond will be forwarded along with the call up letter for admission.

20. MEDICAL STANDARDS :

(a) The medical standard of admission will be as laid down for the NDA examination. Parents are cautioned that calling for interview and medical examination does not mean that the boy would be selected and they are, therefore advised not to incur any expenditure for equipping the boy in the hope that the boy has been selected for admission since as per rules / procedure 3 times the number of existing seats are called for interview and medical examination.

(b) The parents / guardians are required to take their sons/wards for medical examination at Command Hospital (EC), Kolkata. **It must be clearly understood that for admission to Sainik School Purulia, eligible candidates are to appear before the Medical Board, Command Hospital (EC), Kolkata and must be found to be medically FIT. Candidates declared medically unfit by the Command Hospital (EC), Kolkata are not eligible for admission.** However, the candidate can appeal against the Fitness Certificate to the Principal, Sainik School Purulia with a fee of Rs. 100/- (Rs. 50/- from SC/ST), to be paid by bank draft along with supporting documents / evidence for necessary consideration for re-medical examination of the candidate at the Command Hospital (EC), Kolkata and **the candidature of the candidate will be cancelled if the said candidate is declared medically unfit by the Command Hospital (EC), Kolkata after his re-medical examination.**

21. Before applying for admission, boys should undergo a thorough medical examination to ensure that they are free from any constitutional defects which may render them unfit or appear to be subnormal in the opinion of the Medical Board. The Principal reserves the right to reject the admission of such boys.

22. Parents opting for admission in other Sainik schools except the Sainik school of his own domicile will have to give the following undertaking :-

I further undertake that, in case my son is low in merit in school of his domicile, I will admit my son/ward a full fee paying cadet in Sainik School as listed in column (12) of this application form and will not seek for inter school transfer later.

23. SYLLABUS FOR AISSEE

The standard of examination for admission to class VI would be equivalent to that of Std. V { Maths, General Knowledge (Science & Social Studies), Language } as per the prescribed syllabus of the National Council of Education Research and Training (NCERT / CBSE)

Question papers for Class IX will be in conformity with the CBSE curriculum. Mathematics, Social Sciences and General Science will be in conformity with the Central Board of Secondary Education syllabus upto Class VIII Level. Paper in English will be of general nature and as expected for Class VIII stage .

A few questions of a slightly higher standard may also be included for both Class VI and IX entrance examinations.

Modification in the form and contents of questions and marks thereon of the Entrance Examination for VI and IX cannot be ruled out. Student may answer the question papers in any of the scheduled languages.
